# Community Updates

## Groundbreaking Ceremonies Held for the Rowland Heights Community Center

On May 2, 2013, the community joined in the celebration of the official groundbreaking for the Rowland Heights Community Center at Pathfinder Park. With construction equipment and tractors as the backdrop, the crowd was entertained by students of the Oswalt Academy Band, the Rosas Park Hula dancers, Tiny Tots and a wrestling demonstration.

The Fourth District and the Department of Parks and Recreation officially kicked off the program and celebration which included the Community Development Commission, who is managing the construction project, and representatives from Gonzalez Goodale Architects, and Royal Construction.

Community members were in attendance that had previously participated in community meetings and provided feedback on the type of programs, recreation, and facilities they wanted at the new center.



The new \$18 million community center will be located on the lower level of the park and will consist of two buildings with a shared courtyard. One of the buildings will serve as a multi-use facility with a catering kitchen that can be transformed into a banquet facility for up to 300 people, or a performance arts venue with a stage that can seat up to 581 people. The other building will include a reception area and lobby that can serve as a gallery, and will include a computer room, and smaller multi-purpose rooms for activities for all ages such as

exercise and arts and crafts. Other upgrades include a parking lot, landscaping and irrigation, tennis and basketball courts, and a new splash pad on the upper level. The new Center is expected to be completed by the end of 2014. For more information, contact (909) 594-6561.

## Los Angeles County Budget - No Cuts, No Shortfall

After five consecutive years of fiscal challenges, Los Angeles County unveiled a no cuts, no deficit budget proposal for Fiscal Year 2013-14, totaling \$24 billion. "Achieving a balanced budget is a notable accomplishment given the economic crisis that we have endured without service reductions, layoffs, or furloughs," said Chief Executive Officer William T Fujioka. Throughout this difficult period, the County achieved over \$250 million in ongoing and one-time savings which allowed the County to maintain a balanced budget without significant impacts or reductions to public services.

## Anti-Graffiti Outreach Offered to Local Schools

Last year there were over 230 arrests for graffiti vandalism in the Unincorporated areas of Los Angeles County of which 97 percent of the vandals were minors. DPW launched an educational outreach program that teaches young people about the consequences of graffiti vandalism and a judge can require that parents attend parenting classes. ## Do You Want to Run a Home Based Food Business?

The California Homemade Food Act, was signed into law that allows certain foods to be made in private homes and sold to the public. Individuals who own and run home-based businesses known as "Cottage Food Operators" (CFOs) are allowed to prepare only non-potentially hazardous foods in the home you live in. The food must be listed on the State's approved list and you are allowed to sell the food you prepared to the public, either directly or indirectly. ## Cars for Sale on Public Streets

There has been an increase in used vehicles being parked on public streets for sale, resulting in a negative impact on residents and businesses. The Board of Supervisors adopted an ordinance which prohibits this activity on certain County streets. In Rowland Heights the streets include portions of Batson Avenue, Daisetta Street, Fullerton Road (east frontage road), and Jellick Avenue. A public hearing will be set for July 23 to adopt additional streets.

## Coping with Coyotes

Coyotes are often sighted in Rowland Heights. There are several steps you can take to discourage coyote visits on your property.

- Never leave small children unattended in your yard.
- Keep small pets indoors. Keep pet food indoors or promptly remove dishes when pets complete their meal outside.
- Clear brush and dense weeds from around your property. This discourages small rodents from gathering near your home and deprives coyotes of a meal.
- Maintain trash cans with secure lids. Coyotes have been known to scavenge through the trash.
- Pick up fallen fruit and cover compost piles.
- Put away bird feeders at night to avoid attracting rodents and other coyote prey.
- Do not feed or leave water for coyotes or other wildlife. It is against the law to feed coyotes.

## Firefighters Deliver Sidewalk "CPR Anytime" Instruction

Standing outside of the local Walmart, firefighters were able to train



members of the public in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) on the spot! This program is part of the American Heart Association's "Hands Only CPR" effort to double the survival rate of victims of cardiac arrest and increase the skills of bystanders performing CPR.

### The Problem

Only 31% of victims receive CPR from a bystander outside of a hospital. Traditional CPR classes are approximately two hours long with very strict student to instructor ratios. The cost of training may discourage the average person that does not need the course for work purposes. It is a fact that 80% of all out-of-hospital cardiac arrests occur in the home and relatives are the most frequent witnesses.

### The Solution

This type of training had a better overall performance than those who were traditionally trained in a two-hour CPR course. When carts are left at the curb, they can block traffic, obstruct sidewalks, and interfere with street sweeping. In addition, carts left at the curb may suggest that no one is home, putting your property at risk for burglary. Do not place trash containers at your curbside before 5:00 p.m. on the day before your scheduled collections or leave a container at your curb after 8:00 p.m. on the day of actual collection, or more than two hours after actual collection, whichever is later. 
