

FLAG DISPOSAL

County buildings customarily display the U.S. flag, the California State flag, and the County of Los Angeles flag. When any of those flags become too worn to be displayed properly, they must be disposed of in a correct and respectful manner, known as retirement of the flag(s).

The Department of Military and Veterans Affairs under Acting Director Ruth Wong will handle arrangements for proper disposal for flags that are delivered to the department office. The Boy Scouts of America Western Los Angeles County Council under COO Lee Harrison has also offered to dispose of flags that are delivered to their office.
